

**KITSAP COUNTY SEWER DISTRICT NO. 7**  
**Minutes of Meeting**  
**May 8, 2014**

The meeting was called to order at 7:03 p.m. by President Chris Dew. Those in attendance were Commissioners Dew, Sarah Lee and Roger Tielman; Engineer Mike Yuhl; District Manager Colleen Yuhl; and members of the public Mary Dombrowski, Aila Ikuse, Kate Merifield and Erik Appleberry.

President Dew accepted a motion by Commissioner Lee to move the Public Comment period to before the Financial Report. Seconded by Commissioner Tielman and passed unanimously.

The minutes of the April 10, 2014 meeting were approved.

Vouchers 14-5-1 through 14-5-10 were approved for payment.

Public Comment – Mary Dombrowski introduced herself as a resident of the Fort Ward area since 1975. She expressed her concerns about a possible partnership with the Parks District regarding the Bakery Building and the costs to the District's ratepayers. (A copy of her remarks are attached to the minutes.) The Board thanked her for her input.

Fort Ward Youth Advisory Committee officers Aila Ikuse, Kate Merifield and Erik Appleberry briefed the Commissioners on activities that they have been involved in to make the greater Bainbridge Community aware of the Bakery, its historic significance, and its possible use as a Community Center. These "Fund Raising and Friend Raising" activities are designed to get the community involved, and include:

1. Working with the Historic Preservation Commission to get the Bakery Building listed on its registry.
2. Making a presentation to Rotary as a part of the effort to raise funds to restore the building.
3. Meeting with Parks District staff to ask them to work with us.
4. Making contact with the Bainbridge Parks Foundation regarding their ability to accept donations under their 501(c)3 classification.

Following this presentation, there was discussion about the next steps. The District is still awaiting an estimate of the cost of any renovations to the building from Parks staff, before setting up a Community Meeting to receive the Community's input regarding a possible partnership with the Parks District.

The Commissioners thanked the students for their activities in behalf of the community.
